"Chaplain Steven Rogers is a life coach and recently retired military captain who concluded his service as a Chaplain for the 1st Brigade Headquarters, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) at Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

In this role, he provided comprehensive religious support, advisement to command leadership, and pastoral care to Soldiers and their families. Prior to this assignment, he served as the Chaplain for 1-32 Cavalry Regiment at Fort Campbell, following an Air Force assignment with the 55th Wing at Offutt Air Force Base in Omaha, Nebraska, where he served as a clinically board-certified chaplain within the 55th Medical Group.

In his capacity as a clinical chaplain, Chaplain Rogers delivered pastoral counseling, crisis intervention, and spiritual care across a wide spectrum of needs, including medical and behavioral health environments. He is board certified through the National Association of Veterans Affairs Chaplains and has extensive experience conducting religious services, officiating weddings and funerals, and ensuring the free exercise of religion for service members. Notably, he has served across three branches of the U.S. Armed Forces—the Navy, Army, and Air Force—bringing a uniquely broad perspective to joint-service ministry and leadership.

Chaplain Rogers began his military career in 2006 as a Religious Program Specialist in the United States Navy, serving on active duty and deploying in support of Operation Enduring Freedom aboard USS *Ashland* (LSD-48), USS *Nashville* (LPD-13), and completing temporary duty on the USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN-71). Following his undergraduate education, he was commissioned as an Army Reserve Chaplain in 2011 and later served as Brigade Chaplain for the 104th Training Division, 1st Brigade in 2013. In 2015, he was commissioned as an Air Force Chaplain, where he supported Air Force Space Command and the 55th Wing prior to transitioning to the Individual Ready Reserve and subsequently returning to active service with the Army.

Throughout his career, Chaplain Rogers completed five units of ACPE-accredited Clinical Pastoral Education at Buckley Air Force Base, the Denver VA Medical Center, and Evans Army Community Hospital, equipping him with advanced competencies in clinical ministry and pastoral care. He has also supported military training and education missions, including mobilizations to Fort Knox, Kentucky, and Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama, where he provided chaplain support to officer training and ROTC programs.

Chaplain Rogers holds an extensive academic portfolio, including a Bachelor of Science in Multidisciplinary Studies from Liberty University, a Master of Divinity and Graduate Certificate in Military PTSD from Iliff School of Theology, and multiple graduate degrees from Liberty University, including a Master of Arts in Public Policy, Master of Science in Political Science, Master of International Relations, and a Master of Interdisciplinary Studies. He is also a Doctor of Ministry candidate (ABD) at Regent University.

His military education includes training across all three services, including Navy Religious Program Specialist training, Army Chaplain Basic Officer Leadership Course, the Army Captain's Career Course, Air Force Commissioned Officer Training, and the Air Force Basic Chaplain Course. He also received his Navy Surface Warfare qualification in 2007, and later graduated from Army Air Assault School in 2022.

Some of Chaplain Rogers' awards and decorations include the Airman's Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army and Navy Achievement Medals, and two overseas Sea Service Deployment medals, among many others.

In addition to his military service, Chaplain Rogers has been recognized for his achievements in the Civil Air Patrol, earning several distinguished awards, including the Gill Robb Wilson Award. He maintains active membership in multiple professional and civic organizations, including the Military Chaplains Association, Military Officers Association of America, National Association of Veterans Affairs Chaplains, and the Civil Air Patrol.

Chaplain Rogers is committed to supporting the spiritual resilience and well-being of those he serves and believes in the vital role of faith, leadership, and service in strengthening individuals, families, and communities."
